Important Cafeteria Meal Service Information

At Maplewood Career Center the cafeteria's mission is to serve the best meals our students will have that day. **Breakfast cost: \$2.00. Lunch cost: \$3.25.**Your child may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. **Reduced prices are \$0.00** for breakfast and \$0.00 for lunch.

Please review the following carefully. Students who qualify for free meals may also qualify for a fee waiver. A NEW APPLICATION MUST BE APPROVED FOR THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR TO RECEIVE FREE OR REDUCED MEALS AND/OR THE WAIVER. (Reduced status does NOT qualify for Fee Waiver.) There are two methods for qualifications:

To receive fee waivers, families must meet income eligibility to qualify for free status.

There are two methods to qualify:

1. DIRECT CERTIFICATION

• Is process for the school to Directly Certify a student from the state for Free Status. Notices are mailed the 2nd week of August & periodically throughout the year. If you receive a notice of Direct Certification, you must sign and return the Fee Waiver portion every year. (Reduced status does not qualify for fee waivers.)

2. APPLICATION PROCESS

- Free and reduced applications are part of this summer mailing package.
- A new application must be submitted/approved for the 2024-2025 school year to receive free or reduce meals by both Junior and Senior students.
- **INCOMING JUNIORS** Please submit your application to your lab instructor the evening of orientation, **August 20, 2024** or the first day of class, August 26, 2024

Note: Juniors coming from CEP schools have 10 operating days to reapply from the start of the school year, **August 26**, **2024**.

- **RETURNING SENIORS** Please return your application during the first week of school or sooner. Please hand-in to your lab instructor the first day of class.

How does meal service work in the Maplewood Career Center Cafeteria?



Maplewood Career Center Food Service uses a computerized Point of Sale system for the purchase of school meals. Students will learn and enter their 4-digit PIN each time at the Point of Sale. The system is confidential, and all students will be required to enter their PIN regardless of meal status or payment method, thus ensuring student privacy. If at any time student forgets their PIN the cashier can obtain it at the register.

You are not required to make advance payments to your student's account because the system can accept cash payments daily. However, for your convenience, you may choose one of the payment options for making advance payments.

ADVANCE PAYMENT OPTIONS

Option 1: Cash or Check

Payment is made in form of cash or check made out to Maplewood Career Center. These funds are deposited directly into the student's account and then available for purchases. Credit cards are not accepted at the cash register.

Option 2: EZ Pay On-line Payment

- This is a secure online payment system with processing fee. EZ Pay Registration: mwood.cc/hs/parent-resources/
- ➢ Please note: EZ Pay takes 24 hours for funds to transfer to student account. So, please plan accordingly so your child's account does not run out of money.
- > EZ Pay DOES NOT show Maplewood cafeteria student account balances on line in real time including EZ Pay's low balance alerts. **Maplewood Cafeteria Cashiers** will tell each student their account balance after every transaction.

Student account low balance ALERTS will be sent out weekly via email from the Maplewood Cafeteria Point of Sales system.

Junior account balances will be carried over to the next school year 2025-2026.

Please Note: Senior students should monitor their accounts to have a \$0 ending balance at the end of the 2024-2025 school year. Any remaining balance on your account will not be refunded.

Frequently Asked Questions About Free and Reduced-Price School Meals

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. Maplewood Career Center offers healthy meals each school day. Breakfast costs \$2.00 & lunch costs \$3.25. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced-price meals. Reduced meals are at no cost this school year 2024-2025 \$.00 for breakfast and \$.00 for lunch. No cost reduced status does not qualify for fee waiver. This packet includes an application for free or reduced-price meal benefits and detailed instructions. Below are some common questions and answers to help you with the application process.

1. Who can receive free or reduced-price meals? All children in households receiving benefits from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) or Ohio Works First (OWF); foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court; children participating in their school's Head Start program; and children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals. Also, your children may receive free or reduced-price meals if your household's income is within the federal income eligibility guidelines limits.

- 2. How do I know if my children qualify as homeless, migrant or runaway? If members of your household lack a permanent address; are staying together in a shelter, hotel or other temporary housing arrangement; relocate on a seasonal basis or; children live with you who have chosen to leave their prior family or household then the children may qualify as homeless, migrant or runaway. If you have not been told your children will receive free meals, please call or email Joe Hinton at hintonjo@mwood.cc or 330-269-2892 to see if they qualify.
- 3. **Do I need to fill out an application for each child?** No. Use <u>one</u> free and reduced-price school meal application for <u>all</u> students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete. Please submit all required information. **Return the completed application to Food Service Director, Maplewood Career Center, 7075 State Route 88, Ravenna, OH, (330) 296-2892 ext. 551503.**
- 4. Should I complete an application if I received a letter this school year saying my children are approved already for free meals? No, but please read the letter carefully and follow the instructions. If any children in your household were missing from the eligibility notification, contact Joe Hinton, Food Service Director, Maplewood Career Center, 7075 State Route 88, Ravenna, OH, (330) 296-2892 ext. 551503.
- 5. Can I apply online? NO, However, you can print out the application at the Maplewood web site. Visit: https://www.mwood.cc/hs/food-service/
- 6. My child's application was approved last year. Do I need to complete another application? Yes. Your child's application is valid for that school year and for the start of this school year. You are required to submit a new application unless the school notified you that your child is eligible for the new school year.
- 7. I receive Women, Infants and Children (WIC) benefits. Can my child(ren) get free meals? Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Please submit a completed application.

- 8. Will the information I give be checked? Yes, we also may ask you to send written proof.
- 9. **If I do not qualify now, may I apply later?** Yes. You may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced-price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.
- 10. What if I disagree with the school's decision about my application? You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to the following contact person: Business Affairs, Maplewood Career Center, 7075 State Route 88, Ravenna, OH, (330) 296-2892.
- 11. **May I apply if someone else in my household is not a U.S. citizen?** Yes. You or your child(ren) do not have to be a U.S. citizen to qualify for free or reduced-price meals.
- 12. What if my income is not always the same? List the amount that you normally receive. For example, if you normally make \$1,000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, submit the report with the routine amount of \$1,000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.
- 13. What if some household members have no income to report? Household members may not receive some types of income that are asked for you to report on the application or may not receive income at all. When this happens, please write a 0 in the corresponding field. However, if any income fields are left empty or blank, those also will be counted as zeroes. Please be careful when leaving income fields blank.
- 14. We are in the military. Do we report our income differently? Your basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income. If you get any cash value allowances for off-base housing, food, or clothing, it also must be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. Any additional combat pay resulting from deployment also is excluded from income.
- 15. What if there is not enough space on the application for my family? List any additional household members on a separate piece of paper and attach it to your application. Contact Maplewood Career Center at (330) 296-2892 to receive a second application.
- 16. Why am I being asked to give my consent for an instructional fee waiver? Ohio public schools are required to waive the school instructional fees for children that quality for free meal benefits. School food service personnel must have parent consent to share the student meal application if your child(ren) quality for a fee waiver. If you agree to allow your child(ren)'s meal application to be shared with school officials to see if they qualify for a fee waiver then select yes in part 5. If you do not wish for that information to be shared, then select no in part 5. Answering no to this question will mean your child will not be considered for a fee waiver. Answering this question either way will not change your child(ren)'s free or reduced-price meal eligibility.
- 17. **My family needs more help. Are there other programs we might apply for?** To find out how to apply for Ohio Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) or other assistance benefits, contact your local assistance office or call 877-852-0010.

If your children receive free or reduced-price school meals, they <u>may</u> also be eligible for free or low-cost health insurance through Medicaid or the State of Ohio Healthy Start, Healthy Families Program. Children with health insurance are more likely to get regular health care and are less likely to miss school because of sickness.

Because health insurance is so important to children's well-being, the law allows us to tell Medicaid and Healthy Start, Healthy Families that your children are eligible for free or reduced-price meals, unless you tell us not to. Medicaid and Healthy Start, Healthy Families only use the information to identify children who may be eligible for their programs. Program officials may contact you to offer to enroll your children. Filling out the Free and Reduced-Price School Meals Application does not automatically enroll your children in health insurance.


